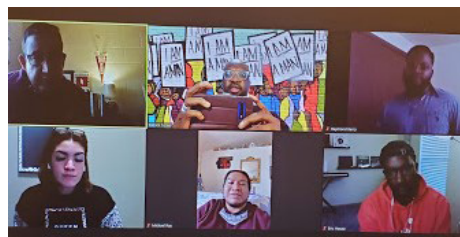
What’s New?
